The mission of the Diagnostic Radiology Residency Programs in the Department of Radiology at the University of Wisconsin is to train compassionate, highly competent radiologists who are leaders in the field of radiology through a collegial educational environment, interaction with world-class faculty, and access to the latest advancement in imaging equipment and techniques.

To achieve this mission, the University of Wisconsin Diagnostic Radiology Residency Program has the following specific aims:
